Dr. Kern is an associate professor of medicine at Weill Cornell Medicine. Dr. Kern's clinical background is in general internal medicine, and her MPH degree included a concentration in health policy and management. Dr. Kern is a health services researcher whose work focuses on improving the delivery of ambulatory care, especially for patients with chronic conditions. She is a national expert on healthcare fragmentation in the ambulatory setting, which occurs when a patient is cared for by many different outpatient providers, but no single provider accounts for a substantial proportion of visits. Dr. Kern will be presenting results from her NIA IMPACT Collaboratory-funded demonstration project. That project informed her recently awarded R01 grant from the National Institute on Aging, entitled "Understanding Ambulatory Care Utilization in Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias (ACUA)." Dr. Kern received her undergraduate and medical degrees from Harvard University and received her Master of Public Health degree from Johns Hopkins University.
